- **Subscribed Libraries**

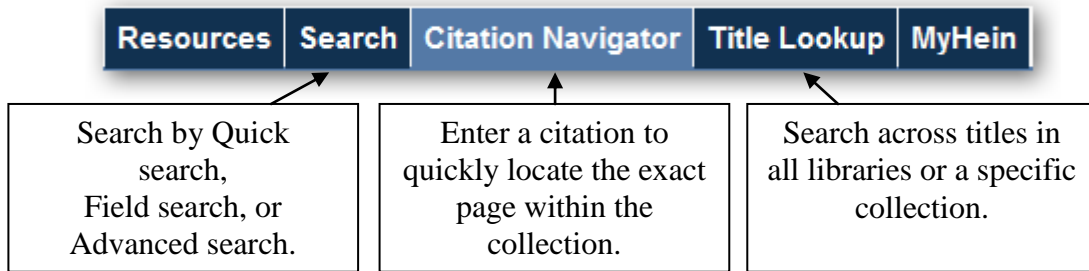
The Subscribed Libraries (including the Law Journal Library and the English Reports 1220-1867) are listed on the homepage. Select the question mark symbol for more information about each collection.

Browsing the Libraries

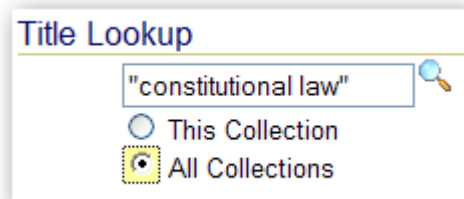
Select a subscribed library to browse the titles available in that collection from the A to Z menu. Select the “+”, to display the years and volumes available.

Searching the Libraries

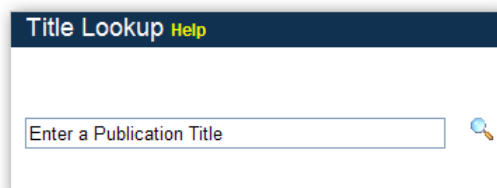
The tool bar displays within each HeinOnline collection.

With 24 libraries at present, it can be difficult to determine which titles are available, and from which collections. **Title Lookup** allows you to search for publications across the collections or within a specific collection. Enter a term or journal title into the **Title Lookup** search box and click the magnifying glass to search. Surrounding terms with " " will perform a phrase search. For example, Entering the term "constitutional law" will return a list of publications that include the term constitutional law, the years available, and the collections they are in.

- **Search**

Select the search tab from the top menu for a simple **Quick Search Box** to search the current library collection. All terms entered into this box are paired with the AND connector, there is no need to include quotation marks around phrases.

Advanced Search

In addition to Boolean searching by subject or within a specific title, the advanced search option allows you to **limit by date**, search for **specific publication types** and **widen your search** across other HeinOnline collections.

Document Display

Once you've located a resource there are various navigation possibilities. Select a specific page from the drop-down menu at the top of the page, or scroll down the **Table of Contents** on the left side of the page to select a specific article.
